What is our operating status?

Along with the rest of District government, our agency remains operational. We are operating on a telework status and have made some modification to how services are being provided which are listed below.

How does this impact what we do?

- **Historic Preservation permit review** will be completed online. For more information or to contact review staff, please visit preservation.dc.gov, email historic.preservation@dc.gov, or contact a known staff reviewer by email or phone.
- **Historic preservation inspections** will continue. To report illegal work, please fill out a request form at planning.dc.gov/node/886082 or email historic.preservation@dc.gov. Emergencies may always be reported to DC 311.
- **Chinatown sign permit review** will be completed online. For more information or to contact review staff, please contact planning@dc.gov.
- **Section 106 government project reviews** will continue as practical, with any public consulting party meetings scheduled at the discretion of the initiating agency. Please email historic.preservation@dc.gov for more information or contact a known staff reviewer by email or phone.
- **Case review for Zoning Commission, Board of Zoning Adjustment, Historic Preservation Review Board** will continue although these bodies will not be holding meetings between March 16th - 31st.

How does this impact our physical locations?

- OP offices located at 1100 4th Street, SW, Suite 650 East, Washington, DC 20024 are closed to the public between March 16th - 31st.
