Applicant Samuel Cooper seeks concept review for a two-story plus basement rear addition at a property located in the Capitol Hill Historic District.

Property Description

616 Lexington Place NE is part of a block developed by the Kennedy Brothers. Designed by A. H. Sonnemann, this was built in 1911 as one in a row of eight. At the rear of the building is a sunroom over an open deck. At the alley is a small one-story garage and fence.

Proposal

The existing sunroom and deck would be demolished and replaced with a full-width addition extending back ten feet. At the first floor would be a deck extending back an additional six feet. The existing roofline extends back onto the addition. Because of the grade change, the basement is full height at the rear. The rear elevation would have divided-lite windows and doors. The walls would be clad in fiber cement siding.

Evaluation

The scale, materials, and design of the addition are compatible with this historic district and in line with many previous approvals in this block.

Recommendation

The HPO recommends the Board find the project to be compatible with the Capitol Hill historic district, and delegate final approval to staff.
